I present for your review the 2013 report of activity of the Neosho Police Department. This is my effort to provide you with an overview of the Department's activities.

After reviewing this information should you have any questions or comments about the operation of the department or Neosho's crime rate and trends, I would be happy to get that information for you.

We continue to rebuild the police department after the layoffs. We currently are able to assign sixteen patrol officers to answer calls for service. We are able to assign four Officers on each shift not taking into account vacations, sick time, training days, and unfilled positions. This is only possible if we continue with twelve hour shifts.

In addition we have assigned one officer to the position of School Officer with the Neosho school system another officer is assigned to investigate major crimes for the department.

Our department continues to be a reactive department due to our lack of staffing however we continue to make progress in this area looking to future budget years.

Our Department has been successful in obtaining grant funding to supplement our city budget to support the department. While this area seems to be a diminishing source of funds we continue to apply and are successful in a large percentage of our applications.

Our goal continues to be to provide an atmosphere of safety and security for all our citizens while providing the best service possible within the limits of our resources.

Grants Received

Local Law Enforcement Block Grant (LLEBG)

This is an annual grant the Police Department applies for administered through the Missouri Department of Public Safety to assist with costs for patrol safety equipment. This grant funded the purchase of new light bars and siren boxes, improving the safety of officers in the course of their duties and required a 10% match in City funds.

Total grant awarded: \$9997.00

MoSCAP (Mo Statewide Communications Assistance Program)

Funded through the Missouri Department of Homeland Security, the grant provided mobile radio repeaters in the patrol cars to enable better radio communication when not inside their vehicles. This provided better officer safety and interoperability and costs were 100% funded by the grant with no cost to the City.

Total grant awarded: \$25,687.00

BVP (Bullet-proof Vest Partnership)

Funded by the Department of Justice, this is another annual grant the City applies for that helps off-set the cost of ballistic protective vests worn by the officers. The award is based on the number of replacements needed, along with the number of vests needed for newly hired officers. It requires a 50% match by the City.

Total grant award in 2013: \$2615.71

DWI Enforcement

Funded by the Missouri Department of Highway Safety, this grant provides overtime funds to cover costs associated with extra patrol details to watch for impaired/intoxicated drivers. For 2013, it also provided an additional \$1,500 for the purchase of two portable breath test units. This grant requires no match from the City. It covers overtime associated with officers working during their off-duty days.

Total grant awarded: \$6,500.00

COPS (Community Oriented Policing)

This is a continuing grant that was awarded in 2012, but is a three year program funded by the Department of Justice. This award allows for one patrol officer position. The covered expenses include the officer's salary and benefits, with a 25% match from the City.


Total grant awarded: \$94,739.00 over three (3) year period

Missouri Safety Center – University of Central Missouri

The Police Department was awarded a new Intoxilizer DMT breathalyzer machine from the Mo Safety Center. This updated equipment will allow for better testing when officer's have an intoxicated driver arrest. This grant funded the purchase 100% with no match from the City.

Total grant awarded: \$6,800.00


Incident Reports at the Neosho School


There were 104 reports taken from 2012.

Incident Reports at the Neosho School




